


Figure 4. Location of the nominated site in Latvia.




Figure 6. The territory of the nominated property and its buffer zone. *Prepared by Raivis Jasinskis, 2020.*




Figure 9. Location of the nominated site in Latvia.




Figure 34. The map by district surveyor Friedrich Babst depicts the urban expansion of Kuldīga in 1797. Map from the Latvian State History Archive, fund ID 1679, description ID 162, case ID 6722.




Figure 36. A map of Kuldīga in 1839.




Figure 37. A map of Kuldīga in 1879. Map from the Latvian State History Archive, fund 6828, description ID 2, case ID 521.




Figure 127. The historic map of Kuldīga (Friedrich Babst, 1797) with overlay of the attributes of Duchy of Courland and Semigallia. *Prepared by Raivis Jasinskis, 2020.*




Figure 129. The historic map of Kuldīga (Friedrich Babst, 1797) and the contemporary map of Kuldīga with overlay of the attributes of Duchy of Courland and Semigallia. *Prepared by Raivis Jasinskis, 2020.*




Figure 130. An illustration of all urban elements corresponding to the Duchy of Courland and Semigallia in modern Kuldīga. *Prepared by Raivis Jasinskis, 2020.*




Figure 132. An illustration of all urban elements corresponding to the Duchy of Courland and Semigallia when overlayed on the map of Kuldīga of 1797. *Prepared by Raivis Jasinskis, 2020.*




Figure 136. An overview of original 17th and 18th century architectural elements carrying the Outstanding Universal Value. *Prepared by Raivis Jasinskis, 2020*




Figure 138. An overview of buildings constructed after 1795 that were built in accordance with the architectural style that developed during the Duchy of Courland and Semigallia. *Prepared by Raivis Jasinskis, 2020*




Figure 139. The combination of buildings from the 17th and 18th centuries with later buildings following the traditional building style makes for a high density of architectural elements representing the Duchy of Courland and Semigallia.




Figure 140. Kuldīga vicinity map, 1798, approximate size 10x7km. About 40% of the names of houses and settlements have been preserved (marked on the map). Prepared by SIA "Arhitektoniskās izpētes grupa", 2020.





Figure 141. Kuldīga vicinity map, 2019.




Figure 170. Map of the historic centre of Kuldīga marking places of archaeological excavations where objects dating back to the 16th-18th century have been found according to the data provided by archaeologist Mārtiņš Lūsēns. *Prepared by Raivis Jasinskis, 2020.*




Figure 213. Ownership of property in the territory of the nominated property and its buffer zone, *source: State Land Service of the Republic of Latvia. Prepared by Raivis Jasinskis, 2020*




Figure 214. Objects and territories of culture monuments and their protection zones. Prepared by SIA "Metrum", 2020.




Figure 215. Objects and territories of natural monuments and their protection zones. Prepared by SIA "Metrum", 2020.
